A range of organisations have been working with Learning and Teaching Scotland and the Scottish Government on Education for Sustainable Development. The goal of sustainable development is that all people throughout the world satisfy their basic needs and enjoy a better quality of life without compromising the quality of life of future generations. There has been a growing recognition over the first five years of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development that more can be done to help community groups to learn about sustainable development and how they can actively contribute towards it.
